New Students: Enrollment forms and the non-refundable \$50 fee are due to the school office by **April 15th**. If enrolled by that date families will receive a \$50 deduction off the next year's tuition.

Returning students: Enrollment forms and a non-refundable \$50 fee are due by **March 1st**. Returning student enrollments received after March 1st will be assessed a \$50 late fee.

Scholarships are available. Contact the school office for more information. Applications are due by June 1st. **The TADS application must be filled out by all families seeking any financial aid for the upcoming school year. It is available online at www.tuitionaid.com.**

Once a student is enrolled, then the educational process can begin. High school life is underway! Parents and students are scheduled to meet with the Administration to set goals and map the curriculum course to reach those goals.

In 2008-2009 the actual cost to educate one MLHS student for the school year was over \$7,500. The difference between tuition and true educational costs is made up by congregational support, donations and fundraising events.

Tuition for the 2009-2010 school year is \$5,596.

Several LCMS congregations belong to the MLHS Association. The churches support MLHS with 6% of their annual net budget.

Tuition for students attending MLHS who are members from Full Member Association Congregation is \$4,325. (Tuition is less for full members because these churches provide substantial monthly support to the general operations of MLHS.)

Monthly, quarterly or annual payment plans can be set up. Contact the school office to determine which option is best for you. Tuition is payable to MLHS school office the 15th of the month.

MLHS also offers an easy, free tuition payment option through Thrivent Financial for Lutherans. You do not need to be a member of Thrivent to take advantage of this offer. Now you can choose to pay your tuition by **electronic fund transfer**. **an additional form needs to be completed & will be provided upon request.



Remember, tuition payments are due the 15th of the month.

Families receive a 25% discount for the second student enrolled during the same academic year. Tuition for 2009-2010 is \$5,596 and \$4,197 for the second child for families belonging to other churches. Tuition for members of Full Association congregations is \$4,325 and \$3,244 for the second child. Third and fourth children from the same family (all attending the same year) also receive the 25% discount.

Re-enrollments received after March 1st will be assessed a \$50.00 late fee.

Applications for enrollment will be considered at any time—pending available classroom/student space.

Other Fees

Fees

The following fees are due registration day unless other arrangements are made with the school office.

Registration Fee: \$175 (includes yearbook fee and administrative costs.)

Technology Fee: \$75

Athletic fees: Non refundable-\$55 per sport. Students are required to maintain a 2.0 GPA & have passed all classes in the previous quarter and semester to remain eligible for athletics.

Graduation fee: \$50 for Seniors

Student Health Insurance: Optional

Lunch Account: \$3.00 per lunch per student. **This is a separate account—please pay by separate check.** You can pay in advance and deductions will be made when your student eats. *It is the student's responsibility to keep this account current. The MLHS hot lunch is set up as a convenience for families. Families are encouraged to supplement lunches with fruits, vegetables and dairy products or bring their own meals.*

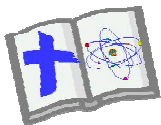
