Artisan Workshop

"Art" is rooted in the Latin word for 'craft'. Students of Art are 'artisans' (or craftsmen) creating 'artifacts,' objects created by human hands.

Christians know that we are created beings, living images of the Only True God. As such, the works of our hands can be used to either further and **be in line with the purposes of our Maker**, or be fallen works of base idolatry.

As a Christian school, we know that we are to love the Lord our God with all of our hearts, minds and handiwork, and to love our fellow created beings (neighbors) as we love ourselves.

Any study of art-craftwork **fails** its Divine purpose if we do not keep these principles in the forethought of our minds.

Work: This class is a workshop, for creative production of craftworks. As such, each moment of class is to be filled with on task, concrete works of art. There will be no texting, phone calls, emails, or work from other classes allowed during the art period. Conversations between students, music, drinks and other inducements to creativity are encouraged—provided that they actually and concretely lead to completed projects. Work at home or in other classes is not expected, provided students are diligent in their work during period.

While art can be a hobby, the best artisans produce work that can be appreciated by others, in the church, in the public and in families. There are four main uses of artwork:

Worship, Civic Virtue, Commerce, and individual appreciation. Craftworks always are a form of communication. We will have reflection periods to state what ideas a particular artwork is attempting to communicate. Saying: "It means whatever you what it to mean is an F answer." Often times, these works are produced by deadlines. Therefore, each crafted item will be due either at the end of class on Friday or the Friday of a second week. Some weeks will have several projects, some weeks will have only one.

In days of old, artisans were grouped into three categories:
Apprentice, Journeyman and Master. Apprentices were trained in basic skills, journeymen honed their skills by copying and mass producing the artworks of a Master, and the masters created original works that were often imitated. There should be a visible progression in skill as the school year advances.

Projects will include works of drawing and painting, while works of carving, sculpting, modeling, or use of other media are encouraged. Works of poetry, song writing, or articles on art history are also allowed as projects, provided that they are cleared with Pastor Schultz beforehand. Themes and inspiration from Scripture, the Church, Civic Virtue, Commerce, family values, and individual histories are encouraged, in this order.

As the Christian artisan works for the good of others and the worship of God, completed projects will have these goals in mind, as well the joy of personal fulfillment. Further development will be explained in the year's lesson plan. Ideally, an appreciation for craftsmanship in general will also be engendered.

We start and end with a portrait of Jesus. These portraits give a baseline for development of skill over the semester, and would also underline the Christianity of the course. We start with Jesus, and we end with Jesus.

I use the caption of "projects," as an elastic element to planning, especially with the consideration of half weeks, vacation days, etc. The goal, however, would be to complete a project for each of the 17 full weeks. **We may vary the order of projects, but this list provides a general outline and direction for the class.**
